### TOPIC & PURPOSE:

This report reviews the total statistics related to crime and calls. This public report is to keep our community and the Prince Albert Board of Police Commissioners informed on statistics.

### BACKGROUND:

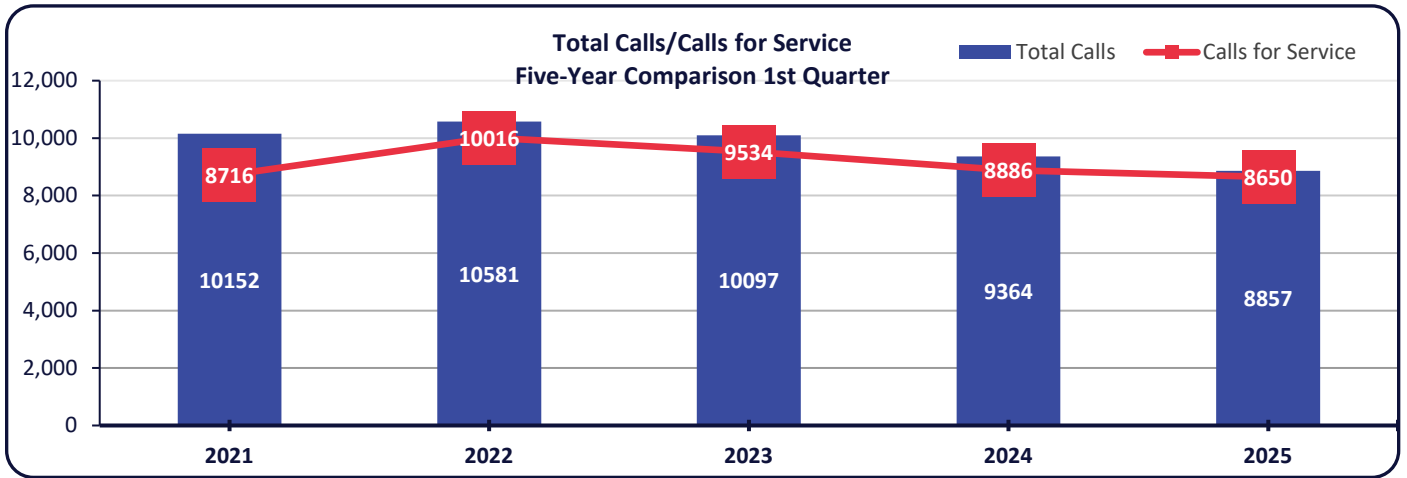
First-quarter statistics, which include January, February and March statistics related to crime and calls are captured, reviewed, and released to the Board and public. The information in this report is measured and compared to previous years and is provided to identify anomalies or trends. This information can be used to determine community and organizational needs and support decisions on resource deployment.

### Calls For Service

The **total calls**, for the first quarter of 2025 was 8857. This is a 2.66% decrease from the previous year.

The **proactive calls** or “neighborhood strengthening” efforts in the first quarter of 2025 were 190. This is a 54.98% decrease from the previous year. There were also 17 court related occurrences.

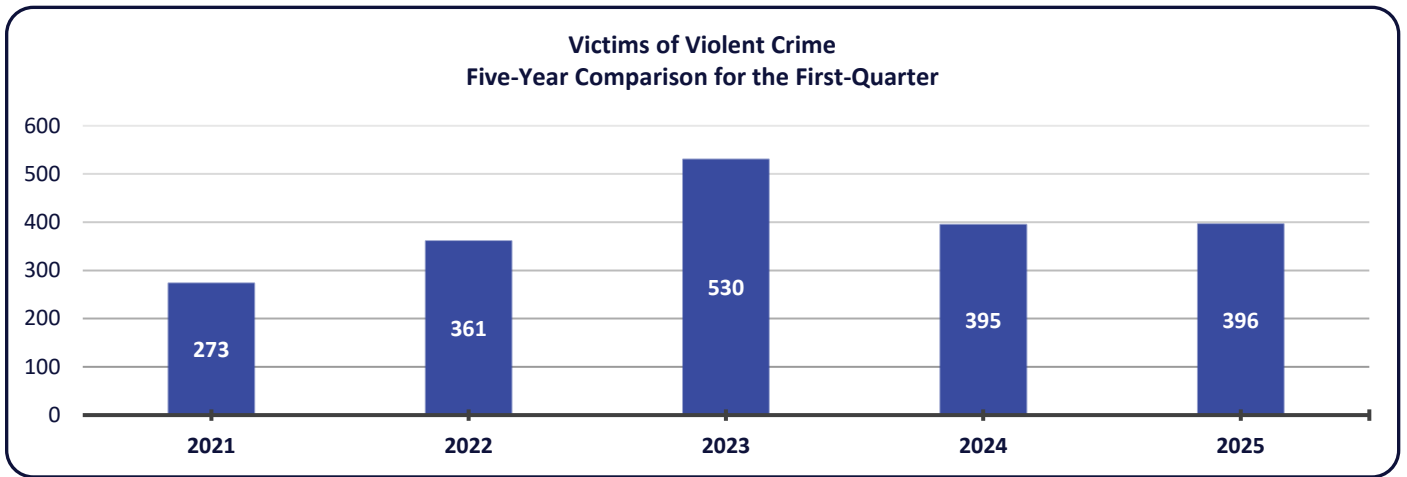
The **calls for service** received in the first quarter were 8650. That is an decrease of 54.98% from the previous year. Eviction calls decreased by 62.37% from 1403 (2024) to 528 (2025) and assaults increased by 2.76% from 145(2024) to 149 (2025).

### Victims of Violent Crime

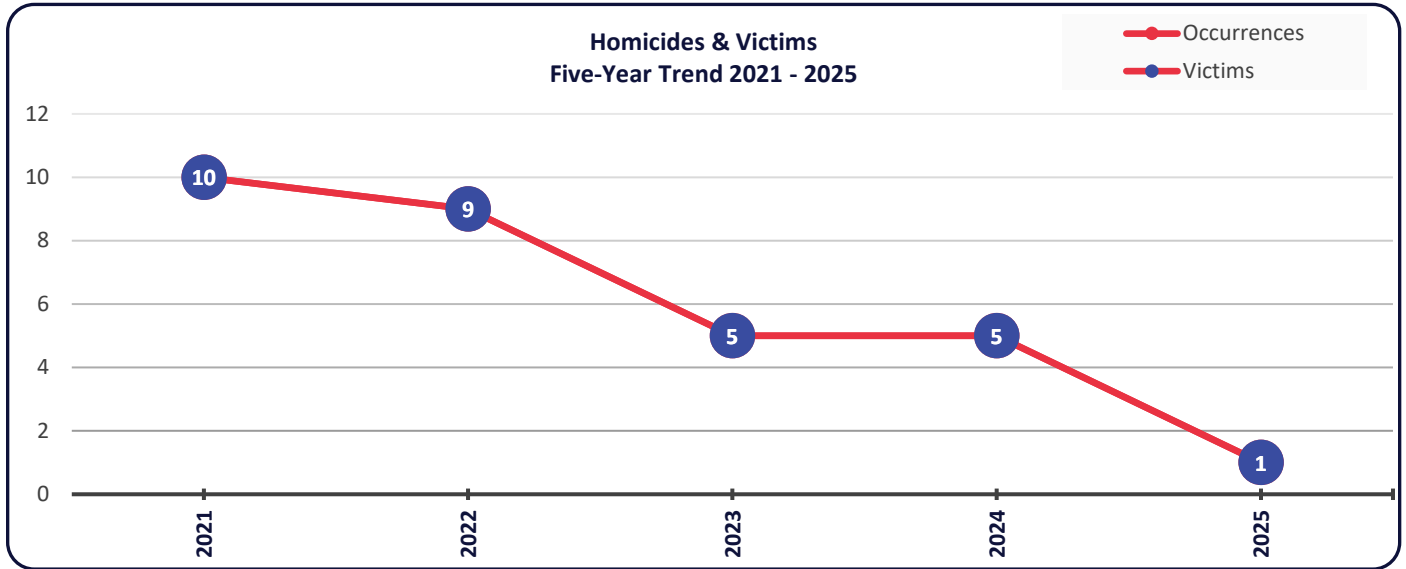
In the first quarter, there were 396 victims of violent crime. In 151 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges.

## Homicides

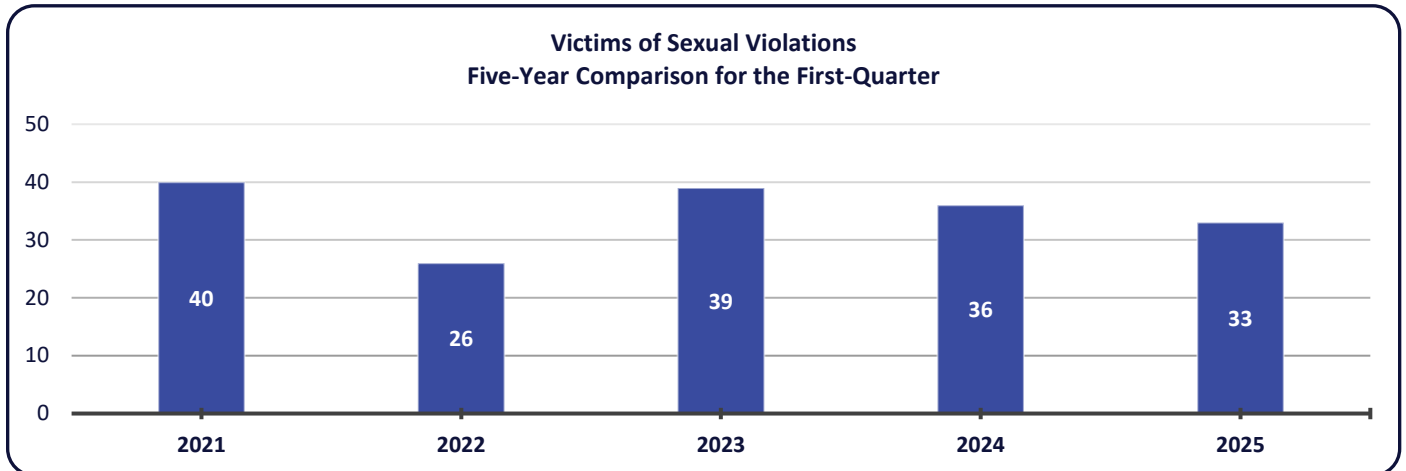
YTD, there has been one (1) homicide and one (1) attempted murder. In 1 occurrence, the investigation resulted in criminal charges.

## Victims of Sexual Violations

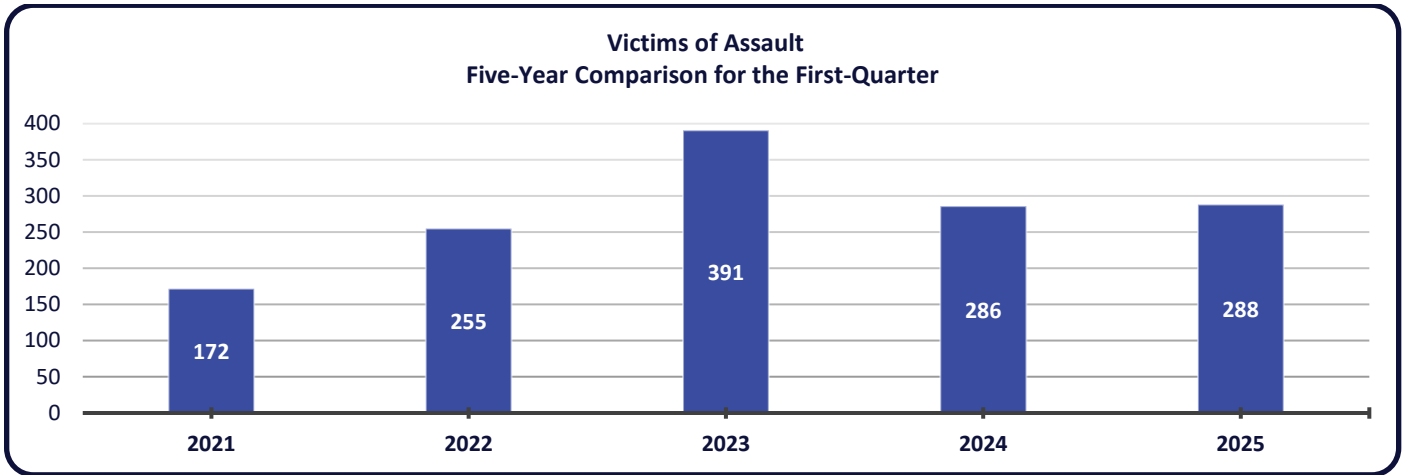
In the first quarter, 33 sexual violations were reported. In nine (9) of those occurrences, the investigation resulted in criminal charges.



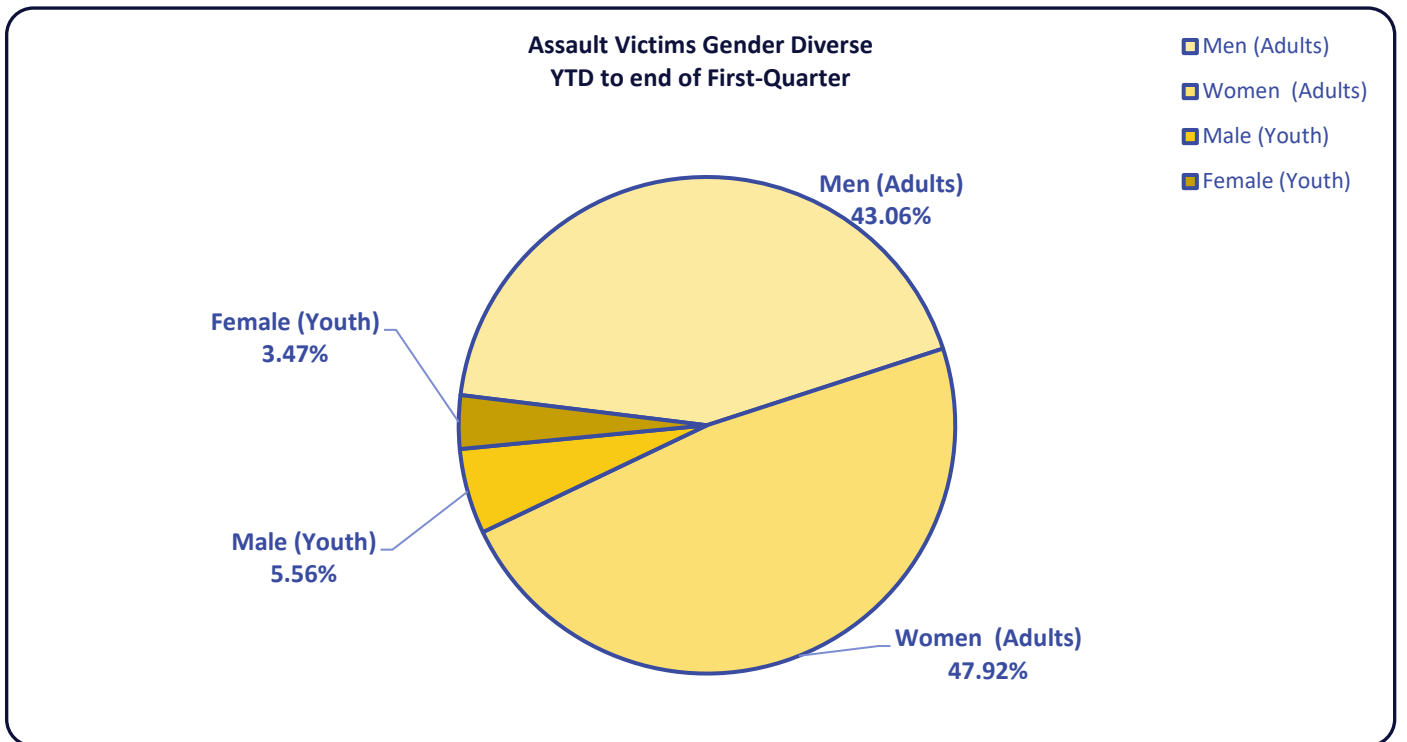

In the first quarter, there were 288 victims of assault. In 120 occurrences, the investigation resulted in criminal charges.



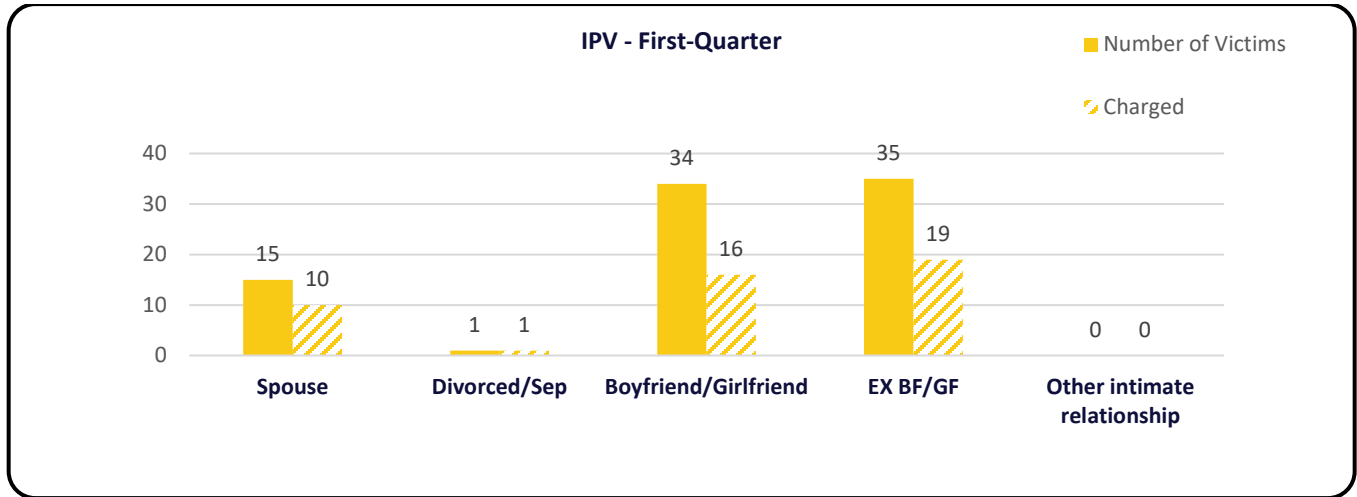

## Intimate Partner Violence

In the first quarter, 85 assaults were intimate partner violence (IPV). There were 72 victims were female and 13 were male. In 46 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges. In 38 occurrences, the suspect and victim lived in the same residence.

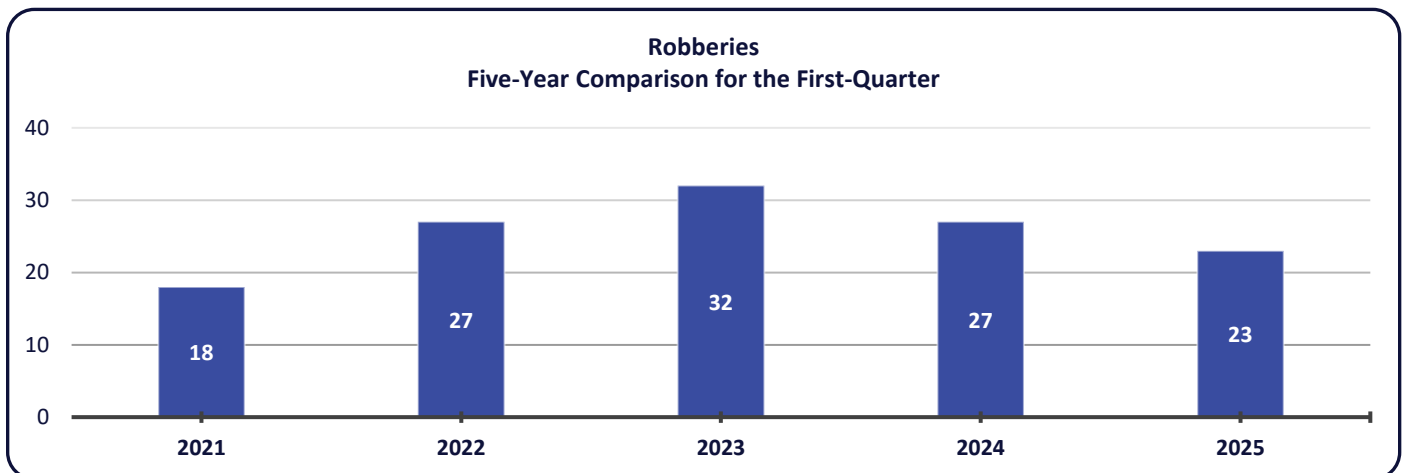


Appendix 7: first-quarter IPV assaults

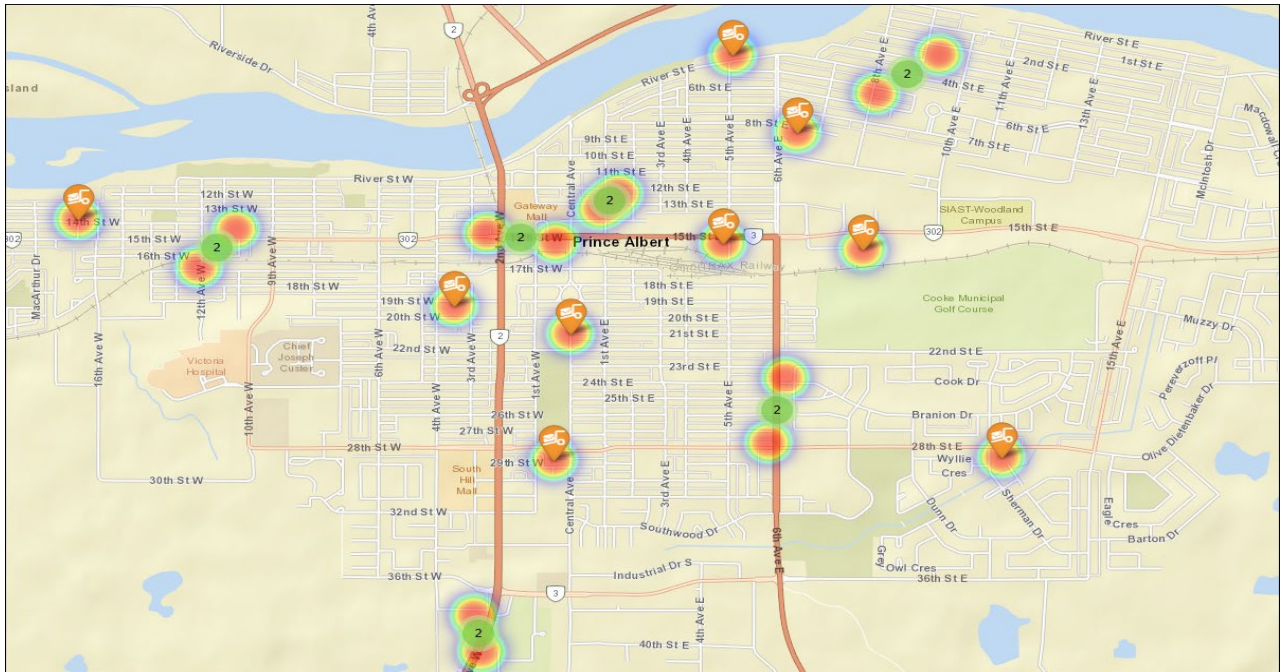
## Robberies

In the first quarter, there were 23 robbery victims in 23 occurrences. In 9 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges. This is below the five-year average for the first quarter, which is 25 victims.

Victims were targeted in 10 occurrences, seven (7) were in open-air, five (5) were to businesses, and seven (7) robberies involved a vehicle being taken (or attempted to be taken).

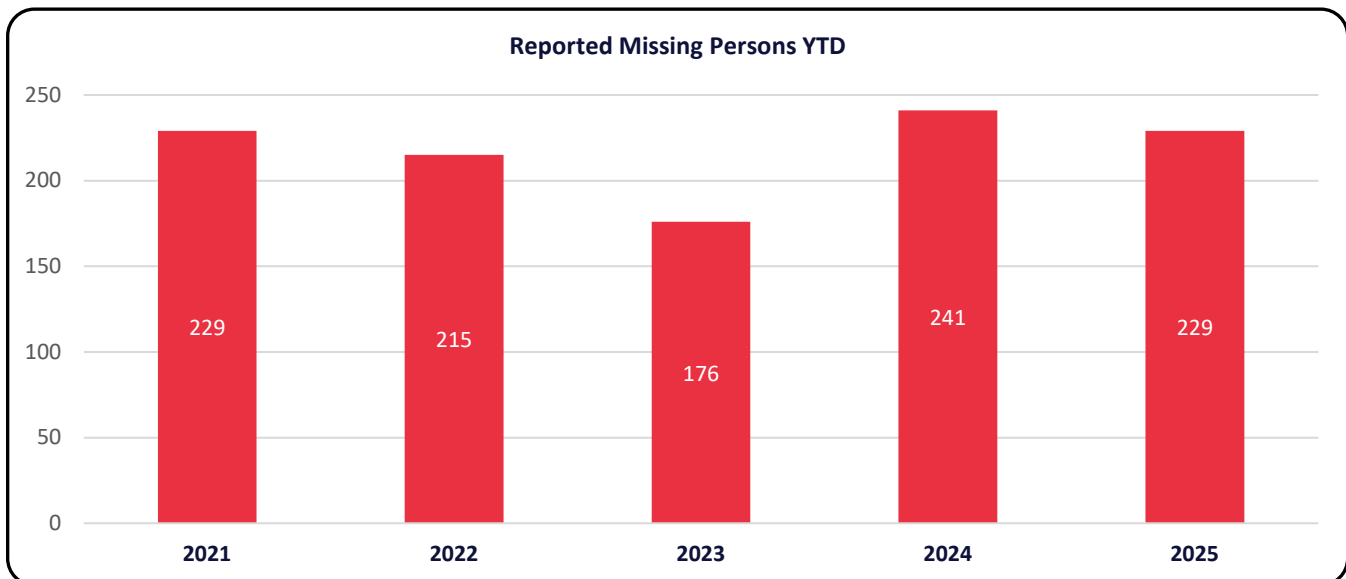


**Appendix 9:** heat map of robberies in the first quarter

In the first quarter, there were 229 missing persons reports. Currently, there are 4 (four) outstanding missing persons at the end of the quarter.

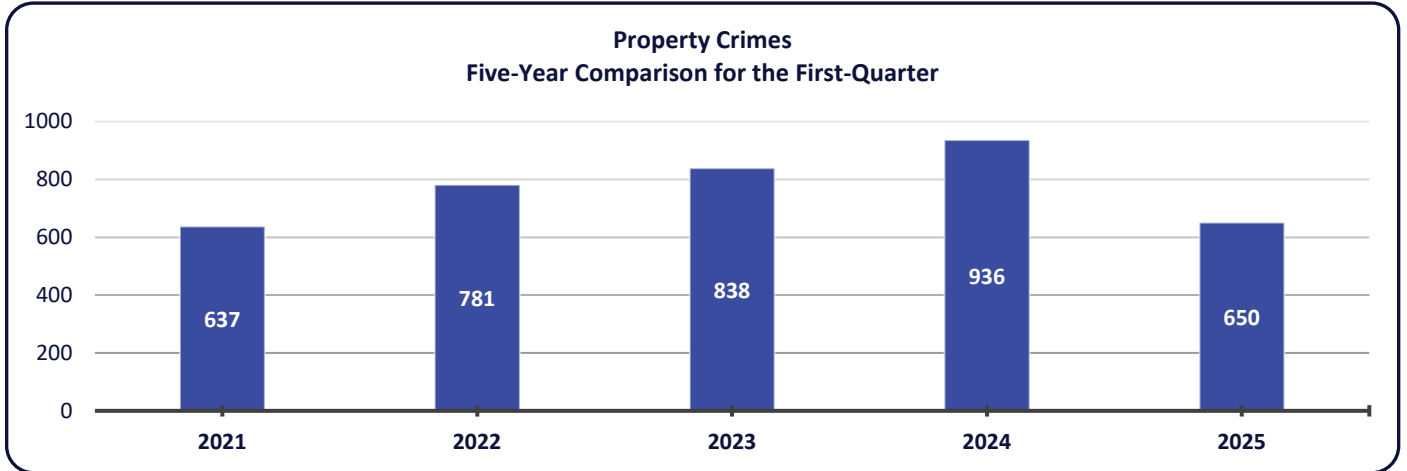
There are 16 active missing persons investigations that were reported prior to 2025. These investigations are led by our Criminal Investigation Division.

## Property Crime

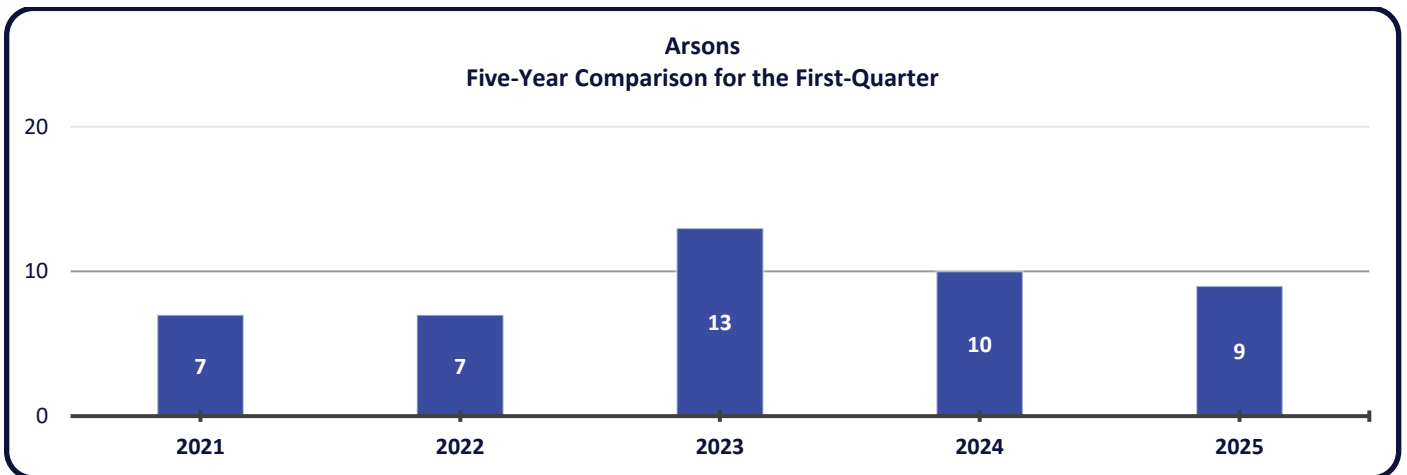
In the first quarter, there were 650 reports of property crime. In 63 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges. This is less than the five-year average of 768.



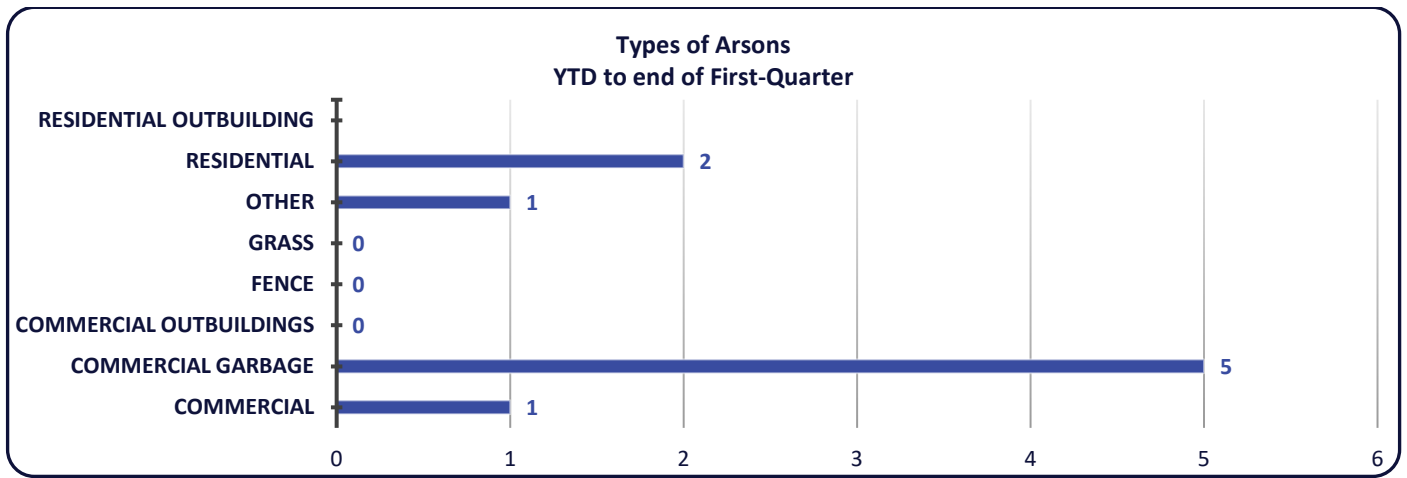

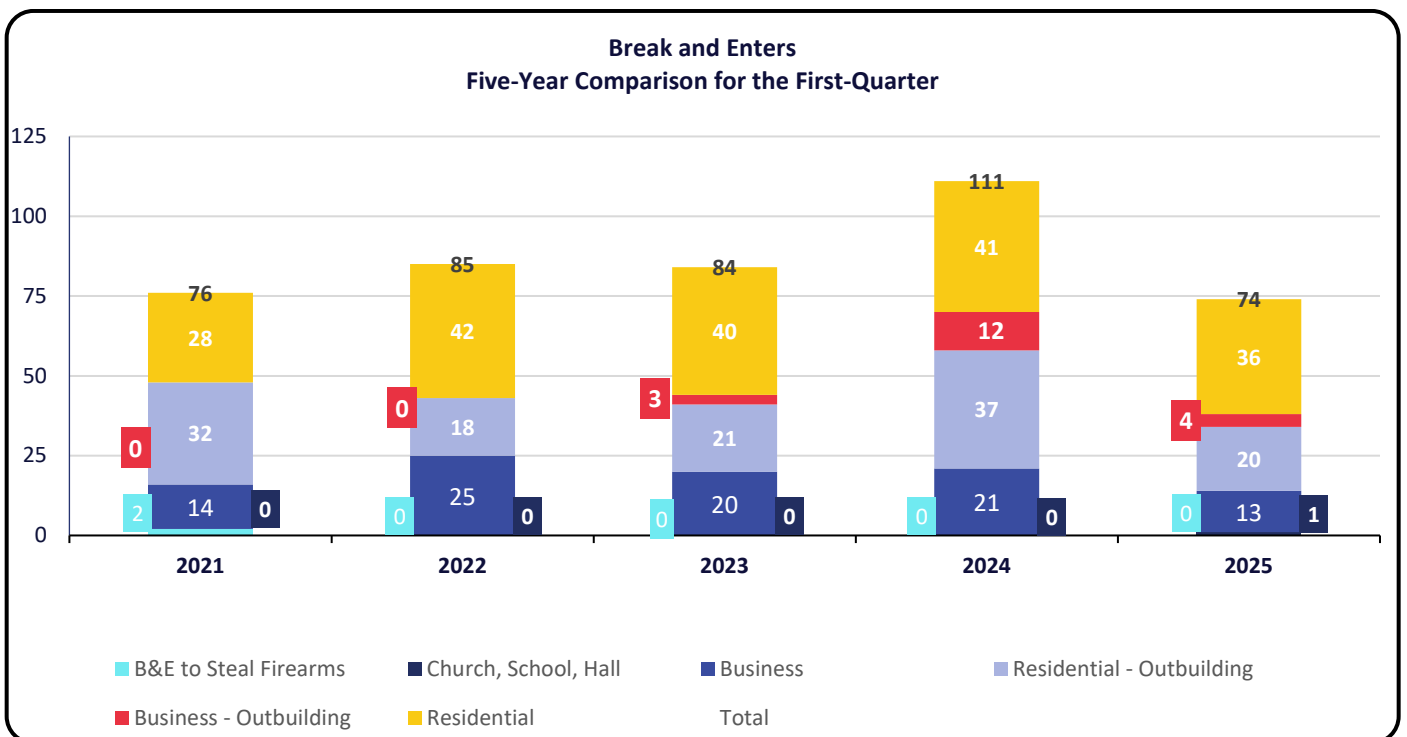

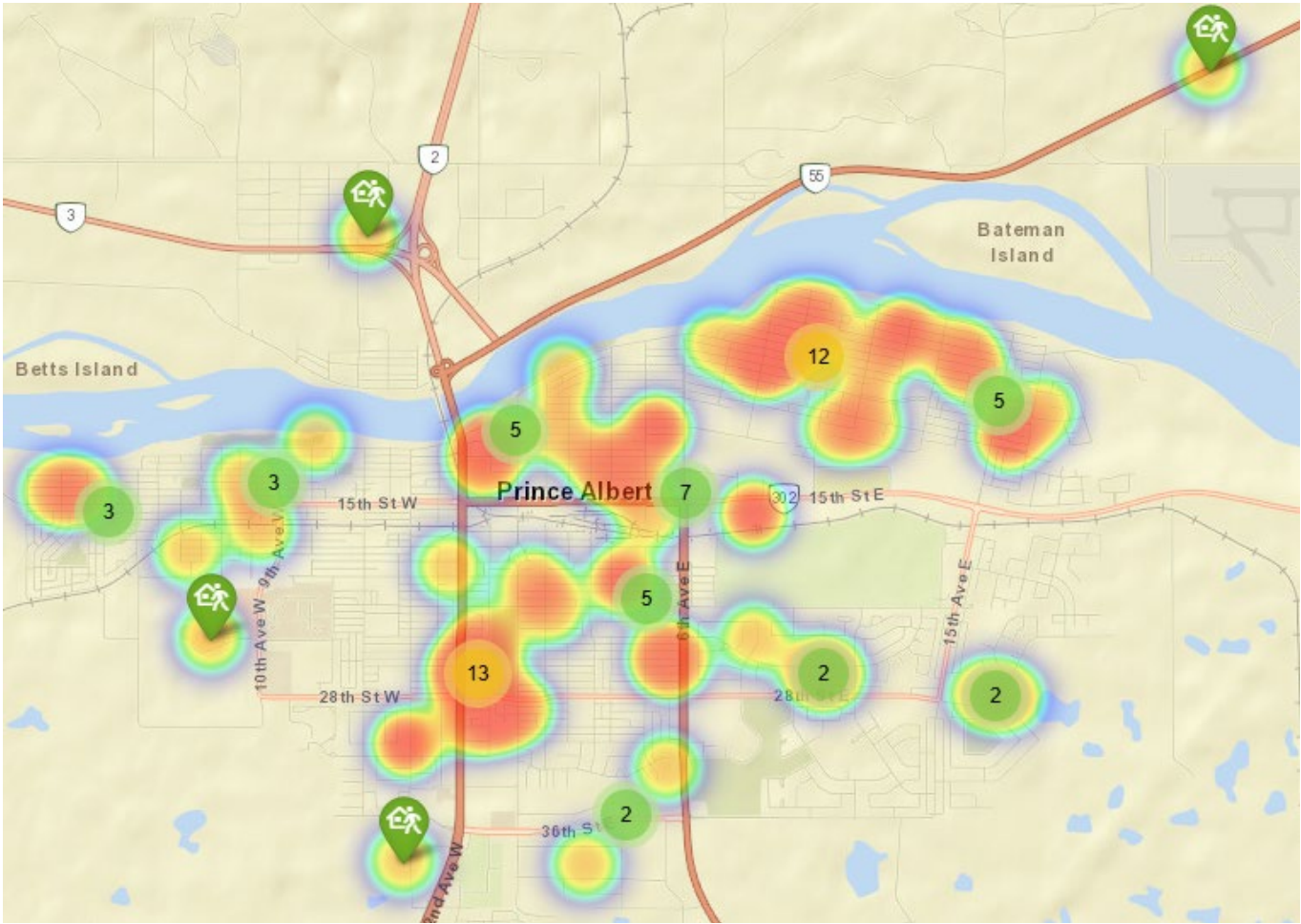
### Break and Enters

The five-year comparison for break and enter is separated into types.



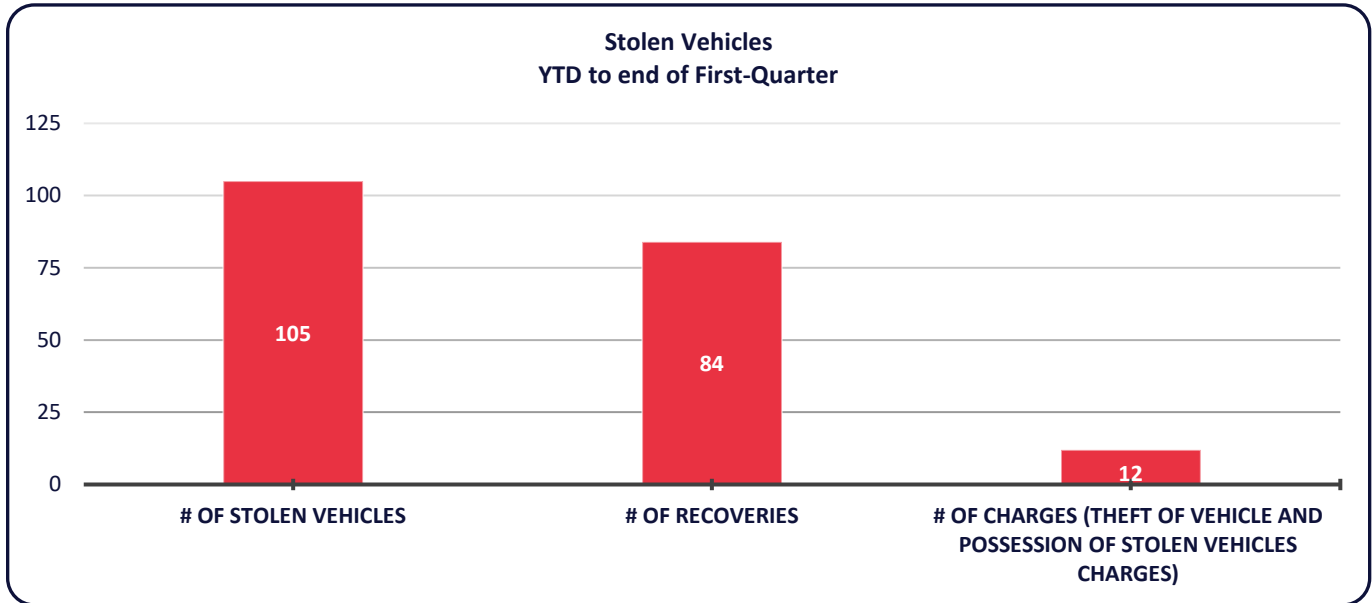

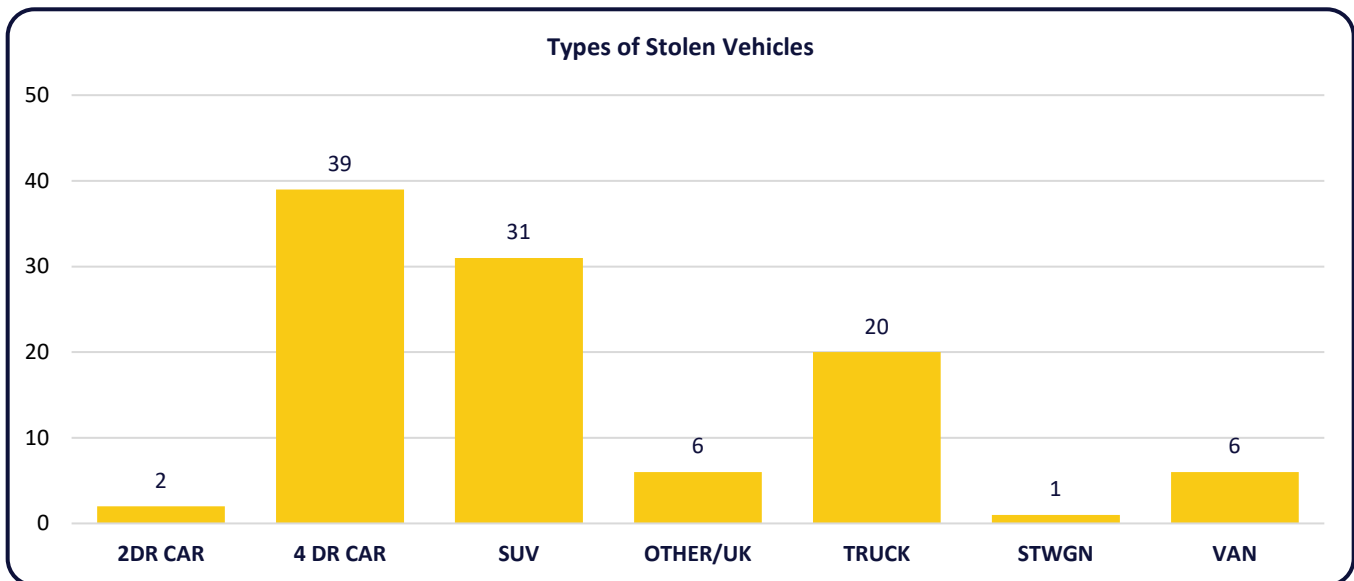
**Appendix 15:** Heat map of all breaks and enters the first quarter

## Theft of Motor Vehicle

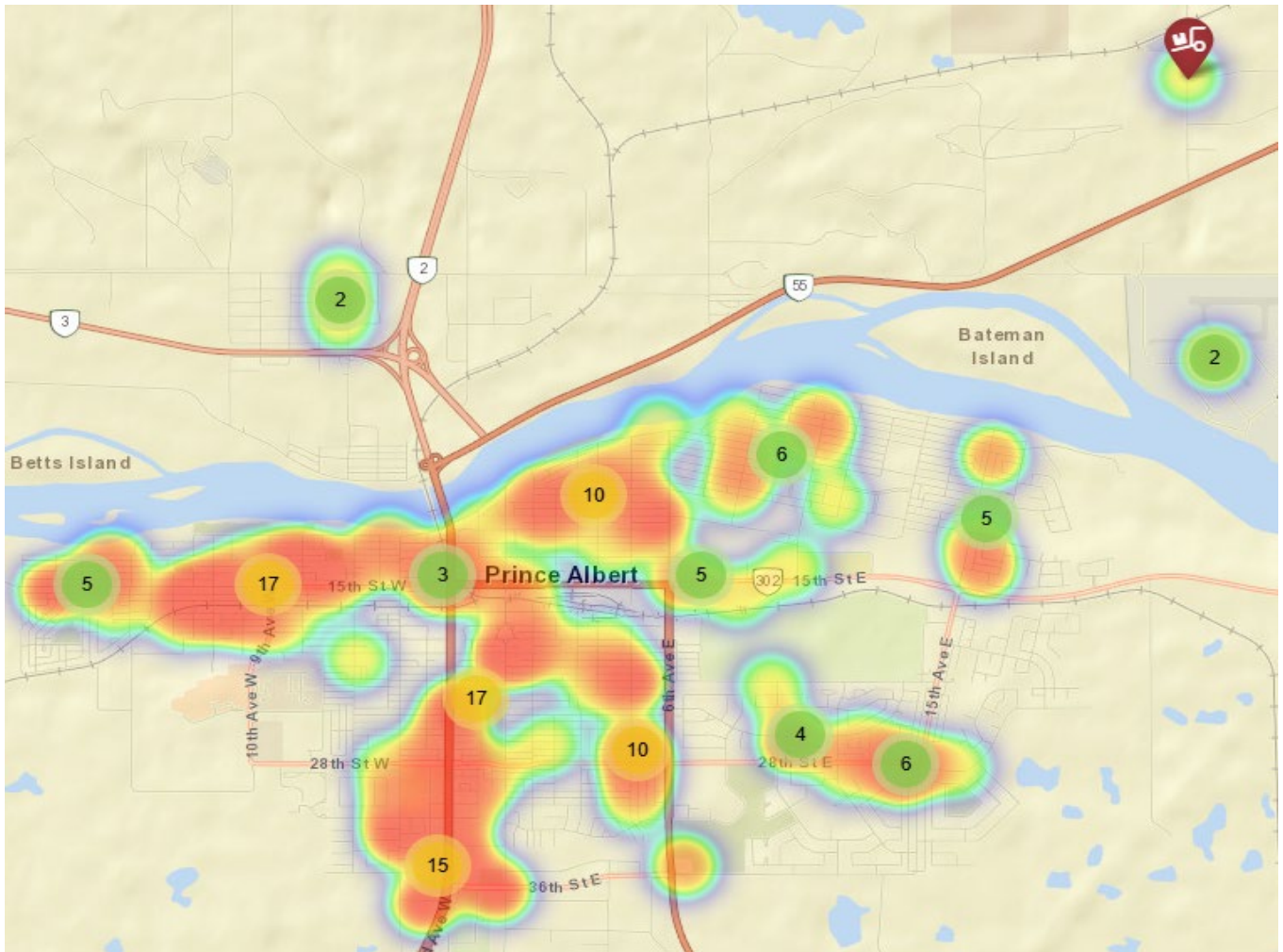
In the first quarter, there were 105 vehicle thefts. There were 84 vehicle recovered and in 12 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges. This is a 11.7% increase from 2024.



Appendix 16: recovery and charges



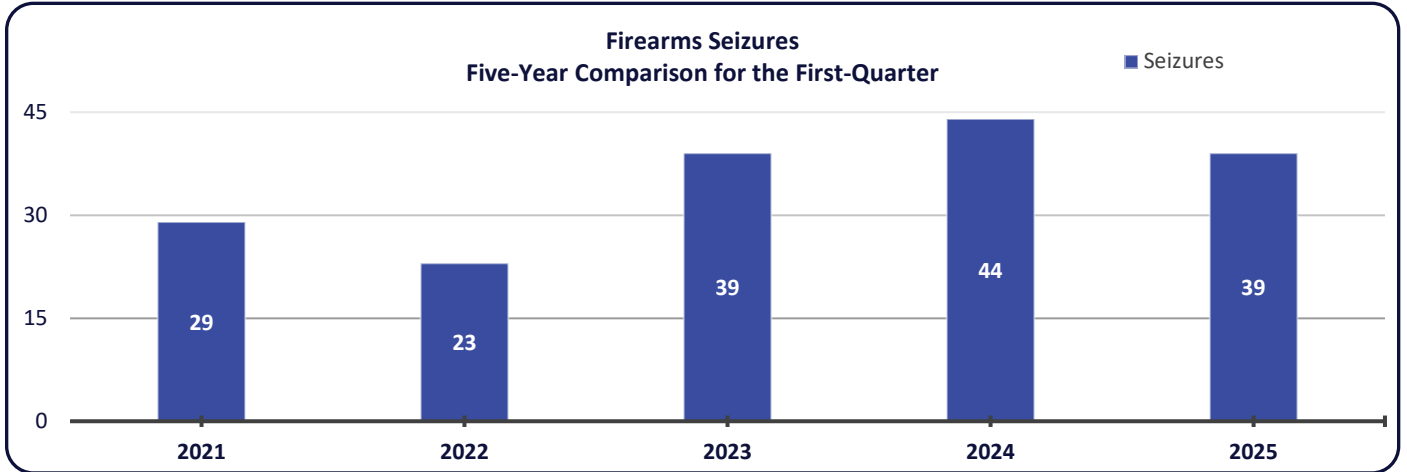
Appendix 17: first-quarter types of vehicles stolen



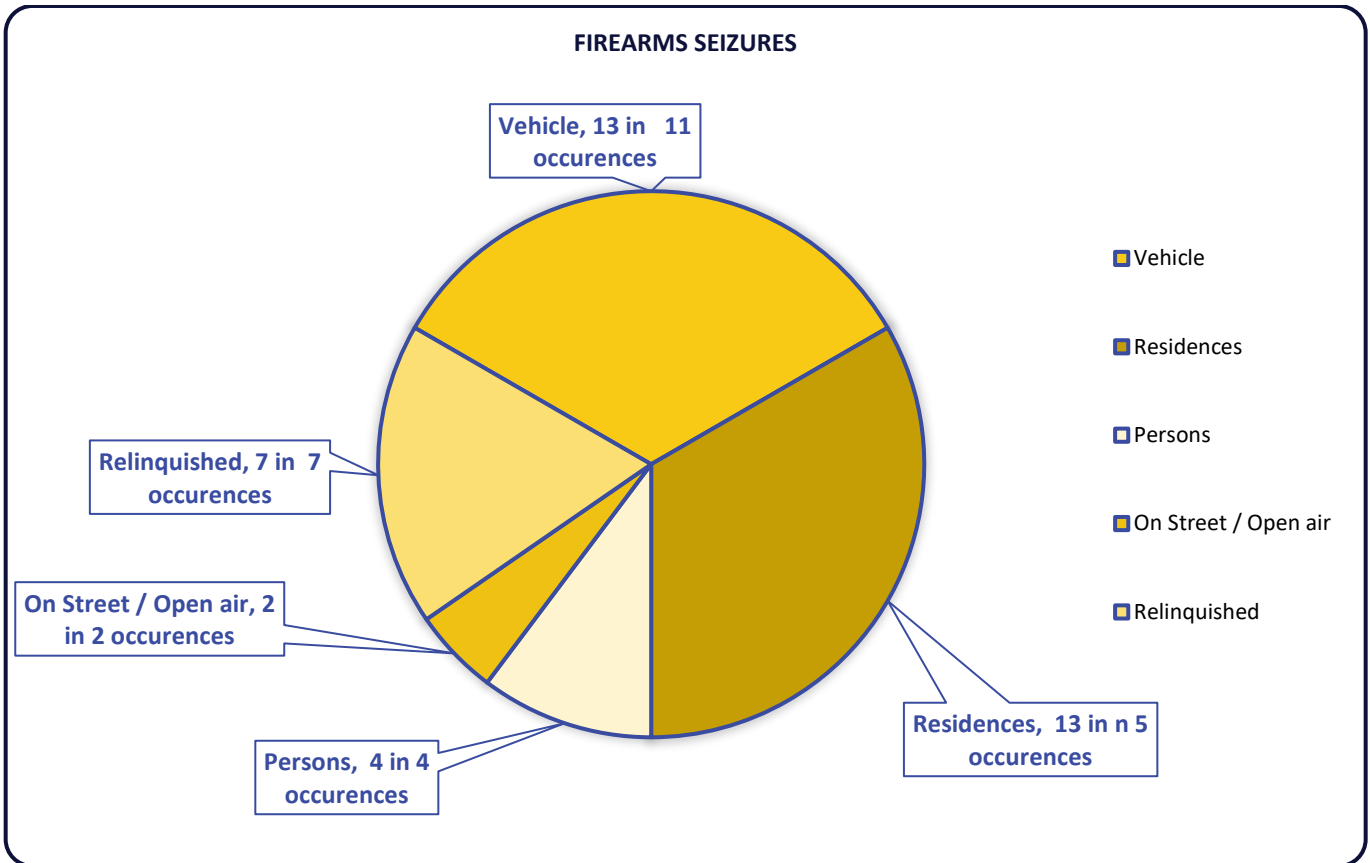
**Appendix 18:** heat map of vehicle thefts in the first quarter

In the first quarter, there have been 39 firearms seizures in 27 occurrences. In 13 occurrences, investigations resulted in criminal charges.



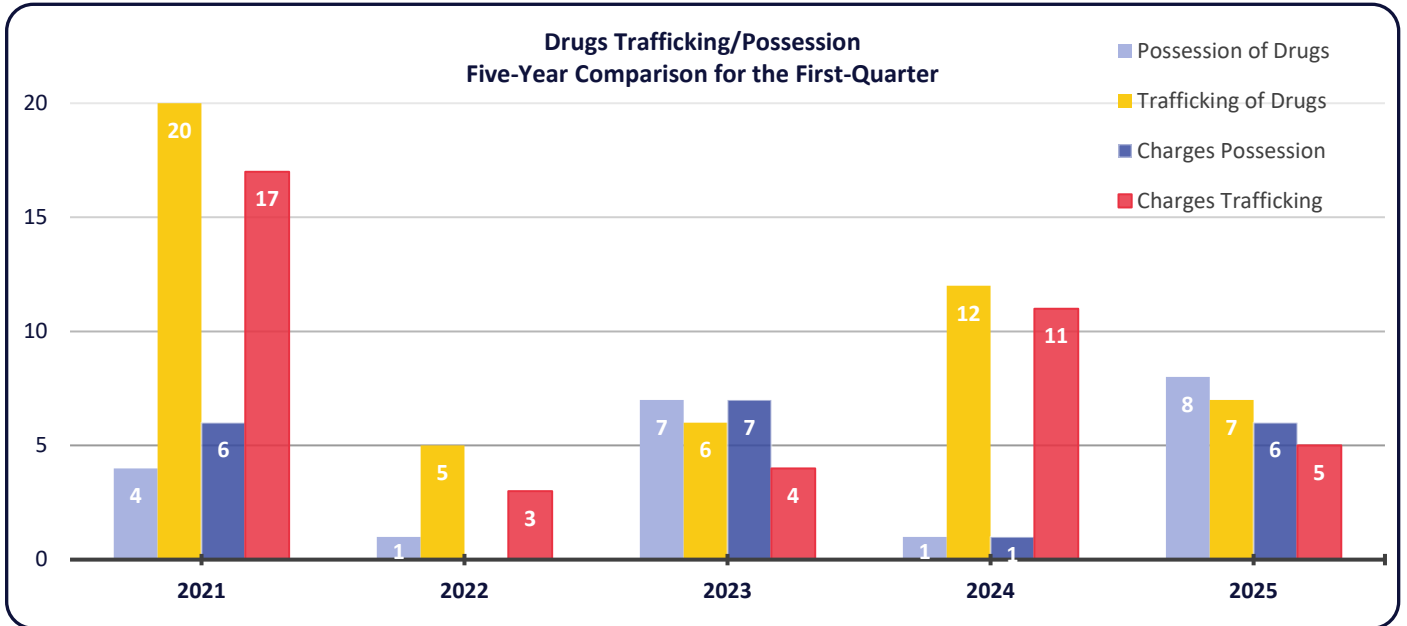

**Appendix 20:** how/where firearms were seized YTD

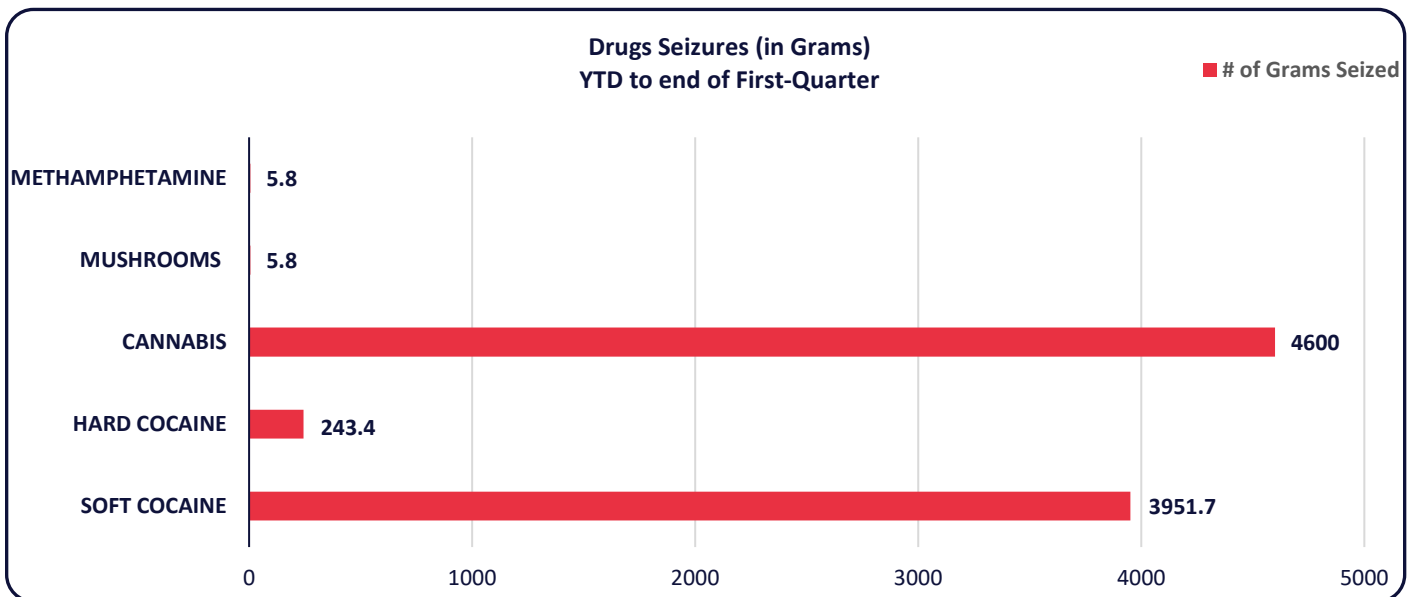
## Controlled Drugs and Substances

In the first quarter, there were seven (7) trafficking drug investigations, which resulted in five (5) occurrences with trafficking charges. There were eight (8) possession occurrences, resulting in six (6) with charges.

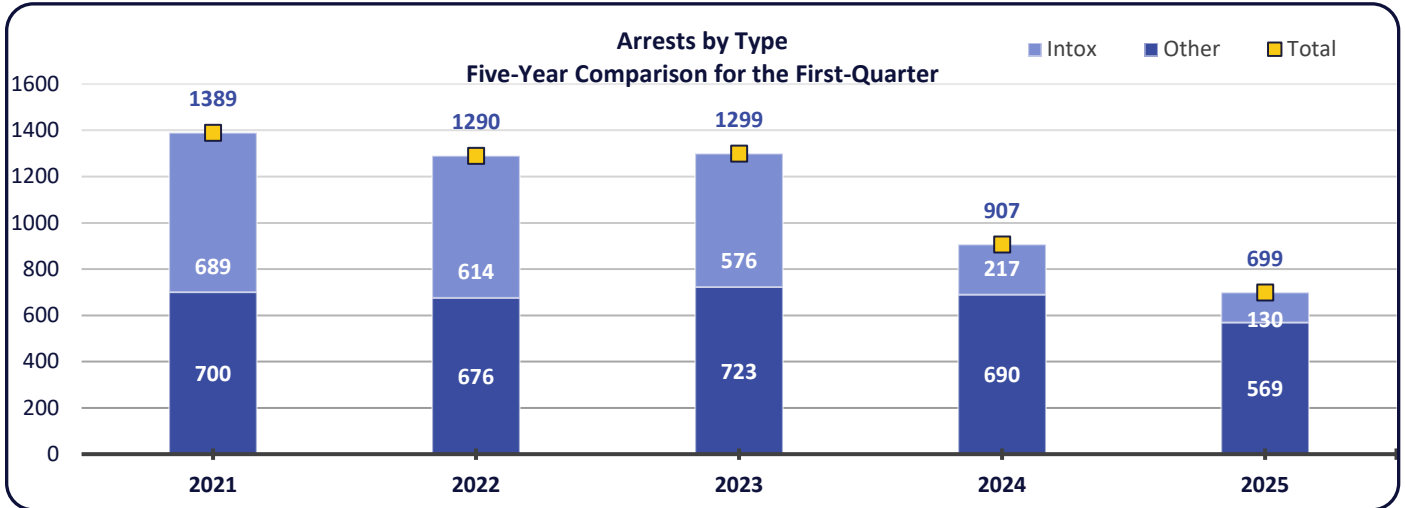
The five-year first-quarter average of drug possession/trafficking occurrences is 18.

## Arrests

In the first quarter, there were 699 arrests, 130 were for intoxication. This is 22.93% decrease from the previous year.

## Impaired

In the first quarter, there were 13 impaired occurrences, 10 resulted in criminal charges; two (2) females/women and eight (8) males/men.

There were also 24 SGI administration suspensions for alcohol and 14 SGI administration suspensions for drugs.

## Mental Health

In the first quarter, there were a total of 270 mental health-related calls for service. Of these, 141 occurred between 8:00 a.m. and 5:59 p.m., while 129 occurred between 6:00 p.m. and 7:59 a.m.

A total of 110 calls were classified as "mental health incidents," 25 were categorized as "mental health warrants " and 135 were classified as attempt suicides. The Police and Crisis Team (PACT) was involved in 53 of those occurrences.

## Warrants

In the first quarter, there were 629 new warrants issued. There were 427 warrants executed, and 91 of those were issued by other agencies.

## Traffic Violations

In the first quarter there were 1181 ticket violations issued, which is a 3.15% decrease from 2024.

Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan (CTSS) issued 79.84% of those.
